Born in Johannesburg, South Africa in 1961, David grew up in Zambia. He spent much of his youth in the bush accompanying his father who was Chairman of the Zambia Wildlife Society.

He quickly developed a passion for the wilderness and its complexities and between him and his brother; they collected a menagerie of chameleons and snakes! In his later years he accompanied anti-poaching patrols to combat elephant and rhino poaching, before graduating to a guiding career in Zimbabwe. In the intervening years David has travelled extensively in south and central Africa including the mysterious island of Madagascar and the Seychelles.

David started guiding in Zimbabwe in 1986 in Matusadona National Park. He moved to Malawi and guided guests on Lake Malawi doing kayaking and scuba diving trips to outlying islands from 1996 to 1998. He then went to Botswana at the end of 1998. Besides guiding in Botswana, he leads privately guided trips to Tanzania, Madagascar, Namibia, Zimbabwe, Zambia, South Africa, the Republic of Congo, Uganda and Rwanda.

He was very fortunate to have lead expeditions in the Canadian Arctic in 2004 to photograph polar bears and other Arctic wildlife.
